A professional attitude sets the tone of the therapeutic relationship. Use self-disclosure cautiously & only when it has a therapeutic purpose. Avoid social relationship with patients Maintain patient confidentiality. Assess the patient"s intellectual competence to determine the level of understanding Implement interventions from a theoretic base. Maintain a non-judgmental attitude. Avoid making judgment about patient"s behavior. Avoid giving advice Guide the patient to interpret his or her experiences rationally. the nurse"s understanding or asking the patient
to explain what he means.
■ Eg; "I am not sure that what you mean. could
you tell me about that again?"
5. Reflection
■ Directing back the patient"s ideas, feelings,
questions & content.
■ Eg; "You are feelings tense & anxious & it is
related to a conversation you had with your
husband last night.
6. Humor:
■ The discharge of energy through comic
enjoyment of the imperfect.
■ Eg; "That gives a whole new meaning to the

	word "nervous", said with shared kidding
	between the nurse & the patient.
7.	Information:
	The skill of information giving.
-	Eg; "I think you need to know more about
	your medications."
8.	Focusing
-	Questions or statements that help the patient
	expand on a topic of importance.
-	Eg; "I think that we should talk more about
	your relationship with your father."
9.	Sharing perceptions:
-	Asking the patient to verify the
	nurse"s understanding of what the patient is
	thinking or feeling.
-	Eg; "You are smiling, but I sense that you are
	really very angry with me."
10	. Theme identification
-	This involving identification of underlying
	issues or problems experienced by the patient
	that emerge repeatedly during the course of the
	nurse-patient relationship.
