**Check list for bandages**

<b>S.NO</b>	<b>STEPS</b>	<b>TOTAL SCORE (10)</b>	<b>STUDENT SCORE</b>
1	Explain procedure to the patient and wash hand.	1	
2	Make sure that the area to be bandaged is clean and dry	1	
3	Stand opposite to the patient if possible	1	
4	Support the affected part adequately ensuring correct body alignment to prevent deformity and impair circulation	1	
5	Keep bandage roll uppermost with free end above site to be bandaged	1	
6	Bandage from below to upward	1	
7	Cover two – thirds of previous turn, avoid loose edges	1	
8	Take requires number of turns so that purpose is achieved.	1	

9	Secure the end of the bandage with tape. Metal clips or a safety pin over an uninjured area	1	
10	Wash hands and Document the site and type of bandage used	1
